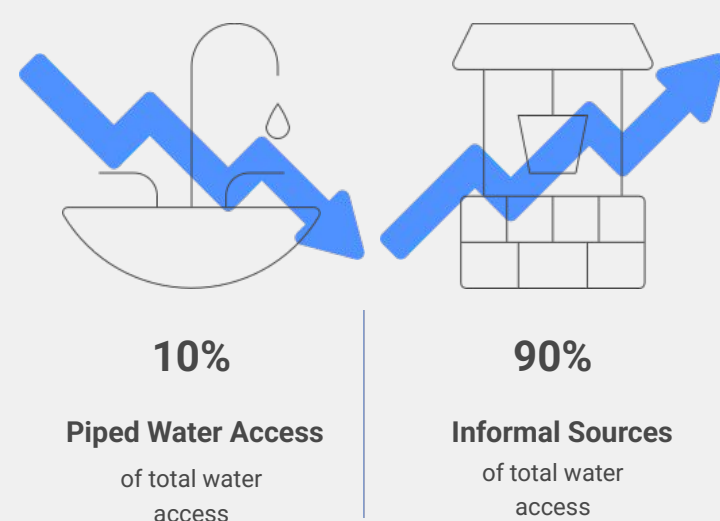

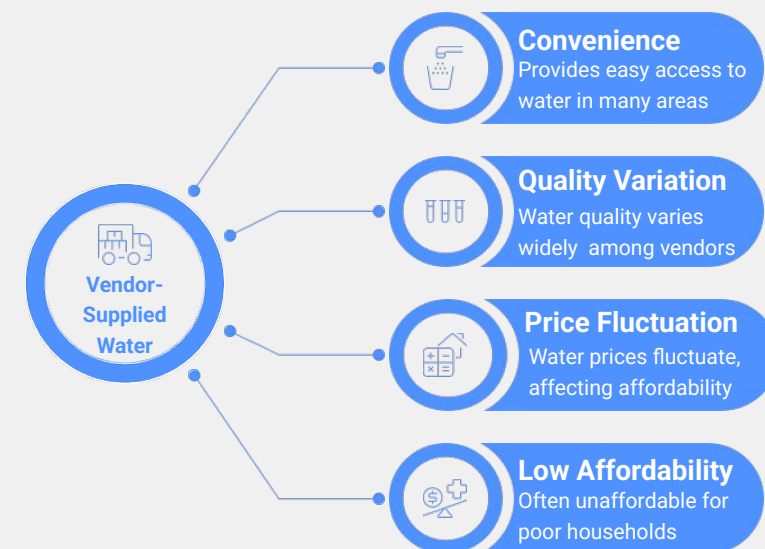
WATER VOLUME DROP-OFF



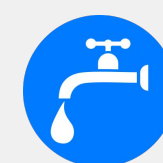
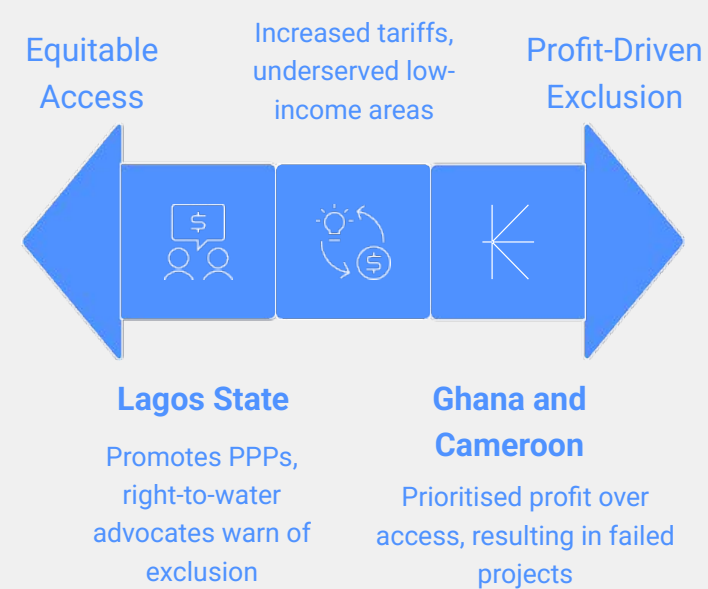
WATER ACCESS DISTRIBUTION

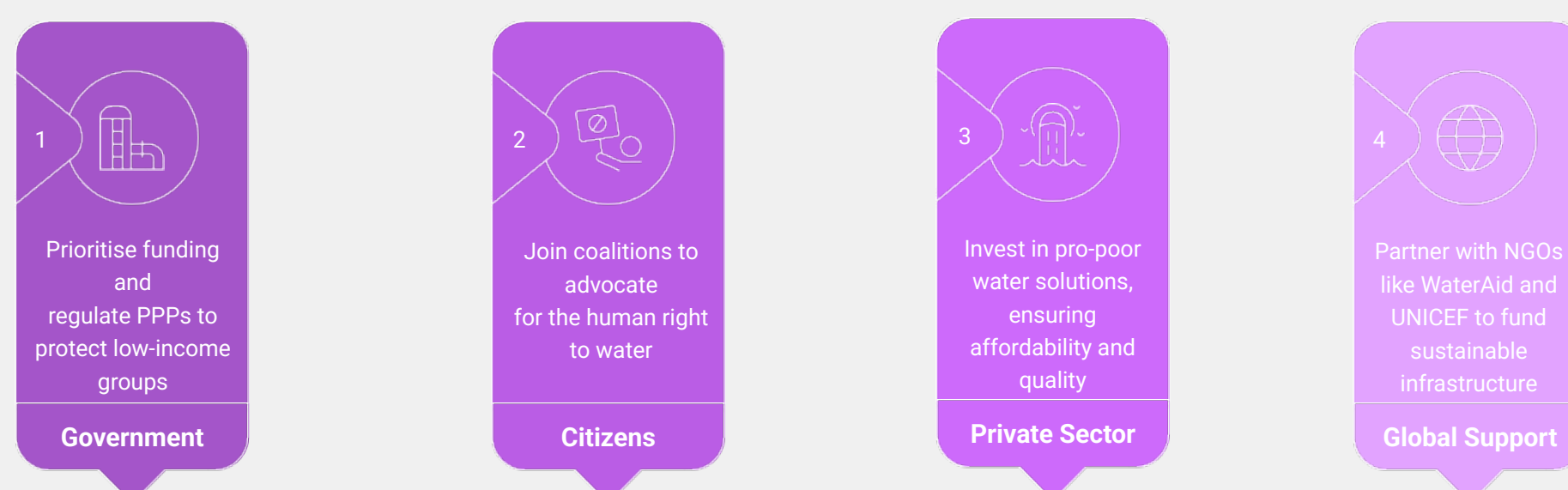


RETHINKING ACCESS

Community-driven infrastructure and service delivery models, such as [the ones we are testing](#) on ACRC, present an alternative. These models attempt to harness existing social and economic capital at the community level to catalyse more efficient and effective water solutions. Community-driven solutions may be inevitable under the circumstances, given that, even with the most concerted PPP efforts, it will likely be very long before water from even micro waterworks can reach the lowest-income neighbourhoods.
